

ASI Community Partners FAQs

WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY PARTNERS CAMPAIGN?

The Community Partners Campaign reaches out to families and businesses for monetary donations to help provide funding for travel scholarships, field trips, and other learning experiences for our ASI students. It also seeks to connect with local businesses and professionals for in-kind academy-specific resources like internships and speakers.

WHY DO WE FUNDRAISE?

More than 25% of our students require financial assistance to participate in our academy related travel and field trip opportunities. Campaign funds help to ensure equal opportunity for all students, regardless of a student's ability to pay.

HOW DO TRAVEL AND FIELD TRIPS BENEFIT STUDENTS?

Field trips and travel provide experiential learning opportunities that spark connections, inspire curiosity, cultivate confidence and self-awareness in students. These experiences also allow students to apply, in a real-world setting, the knowledge that they have learned in the classroom.

WHAT OPPORTUNITIES WILL BE OFFERED? WHAT IS THE APPROXIMATE COST PER STUDENT?

- FRESHMAN YEAR TEXAS COAST STEM TRIP: Exploration in the Texas Coastal Region including Oso Bay Wetlands Preserve, King Ranch, Texas State Aquarium, and Mustang Island State Park where students learn about marine biology issues, human impact on wetlands and wildlife, and environmental stewardship; participate in a beach clean-up activity; participate in coastal camping, stargazing and team building activities - \$500
- **SOPHOMORE YEAR HOUSTON NASA STEM TRIP:** Participate in a NASA overnight adventure geared toward our science curriculum. Proposed trip still TBD- \$500
- JUNIOR YEAR SAN FRANCISCO STEM TRIP: Participate in STEM workshops, discuss the
 engineering marvels of the Golden Gate Bridge and of Lombard Street; visit the
 Exploratorium; visit Stanford University where they will learn about engineering,
 computer science, and biomedical sciences programs; visit a redwood forest; tour the
 Marine Mammal Center and learn about rescuing, rehabilitating, and researching marine
 mammals \$1,800
- JUNIOR YEAR BOSTON STEM TRIP: Participate in a workshop at an MIT laboratory, experience at a hands-on robotics workshop at FIRST Robotics, and learn about U.S. STEM legislation and policy at the Edward M. Kennedy Institute in Boston - \$1,700
- JUNIOR YEAR PANAMA INTERNATIONAL STEM TRIP: *Seniors will be included in the 2024 & 2025 trips* Participate in a biologist-led boat ride of the Panama Canal, learn about Caribbean coast ecosystems at a tropical research station, take part in an interactive STEM workshop and conduct wetlands field work, visit the Panama Viejo Ruins and Biomuseo, go on an expert led tour of Metropolitan Natural Park, and enjoy a folklore dinner and show -\$3,900

WHO QUALIFIES FOR A SCHOLARSHIP?

Scholarships are available to students of low-income families or students whose families are going through a life event that causes financial hardship (i.e. family member illness, job layoff, etc.). Confidential scholarship application forms are available. All families who receive a scholarship are expected to contribute a minimum of 10% of the trip's cost.
